24-Hour Operations at Macleod Trail and Highway 22X

Activity and Location: KGL Constructors will be demolishing the old bridge on Highway 22X that spans Macleod Trail S.E., so that a new structure can be built in its place. The scope of activity will include removing old bridge material from the Transportation Utility Corridor. The work is planned to use night shifts and a compressed timeline to avoid protracted impacts on communities in the area:

- Activity is being staged to complete the majority of the demolition work during the daytime hours and to reduce noise for nearby residents
- Road closures will allow the demolition work to be completed in a short window, which will be less impactful
 for motorists travelling on Macleod Trail
- The closures will also allow KGL to install bridge girders while the demolition is ongoing, which will reduce future closures that would have been required for bridge construction

The demolition work is expected to result in significant disruptive traffic impacts during both daytime and nighttime hours. Commuters are encouraged to consider taking alternate routes to avoid the area. Further details regarding the traffic impacts will be available on the SWCRR project website at www.SWCRRproject.com.

Site impacts and mitigation measures will include:

- Construction crews working 24-hours a day
- Cranes and other bridge equipment working in and around the area
- Ongoing lane closures, road closures and detours
- An increase in noise and vibration during operations
- Equipment entering and exiting roadways
- Dust from activities will be monitored and mitigation measures applied
- Where possible, site lighting will be oriented away from residences
- Operations are being staged to carry out the majority of demo work during the day
 - o With the exception of the weekend from February 1 to 4
