Change of Pedestrian Access to Tsuut'ina Nation

Activity and Location: The ongoing earthworks and bridge construction for the Anderson Road Interchange will result in the closure of the current pedestrian pathway connecting the Tsuut'ina Nation to the communities of Woodbine and Cedarbrae. The pathway will be realigned in October and again November to provide safe access for pedestrians across the Transportation Utility Corridor.

October 2018:

- The existing pedestrian pathway will be closed and a new route will be available to the north of the Anderson Road Interchange

November 2018

- The pedestrian pathway will be realigned to the south of the Anderson Road Interchange along a newly constructed road detour from Bullhead Road to the traffic circle by the gas bar
- A traffic advisory will be issued at a later date with further details regarding the road detour

Please see the accompanying maps for further details. Fencing and signage will be deployed in the area to block the closed pathway and to direct pedestrians to the realigned routes.

Pedestrians are reminded not to shortcut through the Transportation Utility Corridor for safety reasons. There is heavy equipment working in this area to build the structures and embankment for the new interchange, as well as the northbound and southbound lanes of the Southwest Calgary Ring Road.
